Endowed Graduate Award Criteria

- Be admitted to the Auburn University at Montgomery College of Education, with a declared major of the Master's in Counselor Education (any accredited counseling track including, but not limited to, School Counseling or Clinical Metal Health Counseling tracks). However, if a Master's student in Counselor Education cannot be identified, the graduate award will be awarded to a graduate student in the Education Specialist Degree of the Counselor Education program (any accredited counseling track).
- Have a minimum 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale for Master's degree, or 3.25 on a 4.0 scale if an Education Specialist candidate is chosen.
- Demonstrate financial need as verified by the Office of Financial Aid. If a student with financial need cannot be identified, this criterion may be waived.
- Be a resident of the State of Alabama. However, if a student from Alabama cannot be identified, the graduate award will be awarded to another qualified student.
- Be involved in the AUM Spectrum (also known as the AUM Gay Straight Alliance) or other AUM student organization with a similar mission. However, if a member of the AUM Spectrum or other student organization cannot be identified, the graduate award will be awarded to another qualified student.
